It was the third "World Championship" of this kind in the USA after 1908 and 1911. Between the American federation, the "National Association of Amateur Billiard Players" and the "Fédération des Sociétés Francaises des Amateurs de Billard" there were in this time again and again discussions about the establishment of a World Championship with American and European players in cooperation of the federations, however, one came not to an agreement, too different were the ideas about the organization and access modalities. Despite the failure of these negotiations, the Americans continued to call their tournament the World Championship. At least they managed to get at least one European to participate each time.

Other sources, like the French magazine "Le Billard Illustré", the German magazine "Das Billard" and the American book "Modern Billiards" from 1912, give other results, which are often very inaccurate and to a large extent wrong.
