

When it turned out that the Argentine national hero Pedro Leopoldo Carrera would face the German August Tiedtke in the decisive match, the tournament management decided to play the final match at a different location, the Lunapark. This decision - although not in accordance with the rules - paid off: 15.000 spectators - a world record for single games - stormed the stadium.



Pedro Leopoldo Carrera was a favorite of the dictator Peron and, by the standards of the time, lived extremely luxuriously as a billiards player. His popularity was enormous, not only because of his skill, but also because of his appearance. He always played in tailcoat with a white carnation on his reverse (regardless of any dress code at the international level).
