



The final

Navarre quickly took a 22-9 lead and held the advantage for a long time. Vingerhoedt fought, played his defensive skills and managed to tie the score in the meantime. But the Argentine didn't let himself get rattled and struck out in the 59th inning. The Belgian stepped up to the last inning of the night, 5 balls for a draw and a play-off. The opening ball brought a difficult position, which was just solved extremely close. point three was relatively easy and the fourth point was also well playable, but the balls ran out unhappily.

Contemporary report

"Last shot. Six thousand eyes followed the deliberations and preparations with bated breath. Everyone feels that here it can be about the famous millimeter. The position is difficult. There is almost only one way. The ball will have to lose its spin from the third rail. Three-cushion players know the risks of these impacts. The forearm swings once and again calmly. A small pause before the third swing, as if Vingerhoedt is taking another deep breath. The cue is guided with speed and hardness into ball 1. The points of impact at the first and second rail are not recognizable - at the third rail just beyond the fourth diamond the ball rushes - it correctly gets the extension to the first diamond of the fourth rail, - it has to lose some speed if it is not to run too bluntly out of the corner - it takes the fifth rail at the right angle - the equalizer is within reach - still a few centimeters to go. Then the hand of the goddess of luck slips in between and draws a magic line in front of ball 3. The ball runs up to this line. Then it's dead."
