Report by G. Nijenhuis - Secretary of the KNBB

„The competitions were to begin Monday, September 22 at 3 pm. We wanted to be on time, of course, but Ceulemans reassured us. He had some experience in organizing tournaments in South America. When we entered the hall at a quarter to 3, the boards were not yet fixed.

The billiards were adjusted with a meter-long 'snake' full of water. We watched in amazement, and of course the result was a crooked table. In the end, Ceulemans himself picked up the tools, got a spirit level and brought the billiards to level. With that, the games could begin. About 600 spectators sat in the hall and after the first shots Ceulemans stopped, two long legs came out from behind the billiards. What was that? There was another worker underneath, tightening the screws!

There was no barrier between the billiards and the spectators. As a result, many people were running around between the billiards, including waiters who almost knocked the cue out of the players' hands.

Despite the disrupted organization, it was a tremendous experience. People were of good will, but everything went wrong.

Even Mr. Tosi (President of the South American Federation), a very polite man by the way, found it necessary to interrupt the game of Ceulemans against van Bracht to light up a high series in glowing terms. Incomprehensible!“
