The winner was determined by score achieved. In the event of a tie, the lower number of tries was decisive.

The tournament took place after the World Championship balkline 71/2 on the same billiards. The referee was Roger Conti.

The figures to be played are shown in the file "Artistic Programs of figures".

The winner Armando Martinez Sagi (ES) had a bit of luck on his side. He was the only one to solve figure number 12, a follow-up over four cushions, but as a fluke. A conter completed the carom after the prescribed sequence of cushions. Nevertheless, this design earned him 9 points. At the first two Concours International de Fantaisie Classique in 1931 and 1932, such caroms were not yet a fault. This was changed the following year.



## Details

The tournament was severely affected by the cold, wet weather, which had a much greater influence on the ball's movement than it does today.
